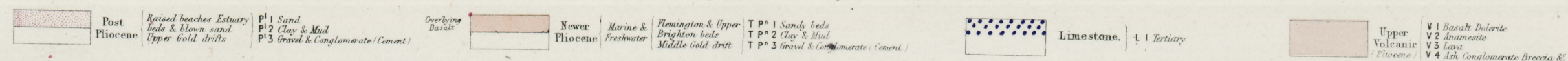


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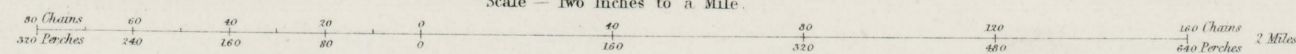

Deposits of sand, clay & gravel of the age of the upper gold drifts (Diluvial or Post Pliocene) occur at intervals along the courses of all the valleys. These deposits are frequently cut through & redistributed by existing river action during floods, forming alluvial A. 12.3. Recent gold drifts.
